- Builds the skills you'll need as a professional.
- Contributes something significant to the Conservancy's conservation efforts.

These can be <u>research project</u>s, <u>art</u> <u>projects</u>, or <u>anything else</u> that meets the above criteria.

THE PLAINS ARE REALLY GREAT

Most of your time will be spent in The Nature Conservancy's <u>Platte River Prairies</u> in central Nebraska. You'll live in a house at our field headquarters, where you will interact with visiting researchers, volunteers, and others. Walk right out your door and into beautiful and diverse prairie, wetland, and riverine habitats owned and managed by the Conservancy along the Platte River, totaling almost 4,000 acres. In addition, the area plays host to half a million Sandhill cranes and millions of other water birds each spring - an internationally-recognized migratory phenomenon.
