Chapter titles should be centered and all caps, with a triple space below.

First Level Heading

First level headings should be centered and underlined. Triple-space above and below centered headings.


Second Level Headings

Leave a triple space above and a double space below second level headings; align with the left margin.

<u>Third Level Heading</u>. Triple-space from paragraph above. Indent and underline. Begin text on same line; notice how the third-level heading is embedded in the paragraph.

Triple space

The formatting advisor often sends email feedback using markups to show examples of the spacing in your document. See the below examples that use a highlighting markup to measure how many blank lines of space are sandwiched between text.

Double spacing's name comes from 1 line of text + 1 line of space = 2.


