Help Needed

It takes a lot of volunteers for an in person fair...can you help with the following?

• Clean - Up Day - Saturday, July 13, 8 a.m.

Please bring wheelbarrows, shovels, rakes, brooms, gloves, etc. to help prepare the fairgrounds for fair. Help is needed to clean the Food Booth, Exhibit Building, barns, put wood chips in all the barns, scrub the small animal cages, wash down the bleachers in the Old Sale Barn and Seewald Barn, set up the panels around the steer area and the livestock ring, etc. Many hands make light work!

• Interview Judging

Wednesday, July 17 - Thanks to those who've volunteered!! Additional volunteers are needed, especially for the 2:30 - finish (approximately 5 p.m.) shift on Wednesday. This could include putting ribbons on exhibits, directing kids to interview judges, etc. Please let the office know if you can help.

• Exhibit Building Clean-Up

Glacier County is responsible for Exhibit Building clean-up Sunday morning at 8:30 a.m. Additional volunteers are needed. It should go fairly quickly, but another one or two families would be much appreciated.

• Pre Sale Social

This event is an opportunity for buyers to interact with 4-H youth prior to the sale and show our appreciation. Help is needed for the Pre-Sale social on Saturday, July 20 at the Seewald Barn. 4-H families are encouraged to help by bringing cookies/bars and/or working a shift. 20 dozen cookies/bars are needed, please bring to fair by Friday and contact Raylee Johnson (450-8041), Katelyn Suta (845-6099), Mary Anderson (450-8053), or Destini Anderson (450-3218) to drop off. Cookies/bars should be in a disposable bag/container.

Members are needed to help set up, work, and tear down after the Pre-Sale social. Help is especially needed for cleaning up afterwards to get tables and chairs returned to the Exhibit Building. All livestock members benefit from this event and are highly encouraged to contribute. Any 4-H member is welcome to participate through baking cookies and/or working. Pig Washing

Reminder, there is to be NO washing or clipping on the scale. The scale has electronic parts and if they get wet, that can cause them to become faulty. Please be sure to always lift up when carrying the scale (no dragging). If you need something to wash/clip in for pigs, there is a heavy duty frame for that at Sahm Winkowitsch's that can be borrowed and used, or many folks have modified the plastic chemical shuttles as well.

Review the Rules

https://www.montana.edu/extension/mariasfair/2024FairBookUpdated.pdf) to know what rules pertain to your exhibits, etc. Dress code is covered, if recipes need to be included, self-waterers are required in pig pens, cattle must have a neck rope, etc.

FAIR PACKETS

Fair packets will be available Wednesday, July 3 with stall cards, camper passes, event passes, food booth schedules, etc. Please be sure to look through your packets and let us know if you think you're missing anything.

4-H DANCE

Clever Clovers 4-H club will be hosting a 4-H Dance on Thursday, July 18 in the Food Booth from 9 – 11:00 p.m. Cost is \$2 or a can of food for the food bank.

FOOD BOOTH

Members are required to work their assigned food booth shift. If extenuating circumstances come up and the member cannot work their shift, they must make arrangements with the food booth day chair or Lisa Terry, to reschedule another shift. Members who do not work their food booth shift will not receive their premium check or be allowed to exhibit at the fair the following year.

MARIAS FAIR SILENT AUCTION

Glacier County 4-H Clubs are asked to donate an item to the silent auction in the Exhibit Building. This year's proceeds will benefit the Exhibit Building for building improvements and maintenance. Items can be dropped off clean-up day or Wednesday of fair. You can also bring your silent auction item to the Extension Office if you would like to contribute, but will not be attending the fair. (Families, please consider donating as well).

MARKETING 4-H LIVESTOCK

Flyers are available at the office and each livestock family will have some in their 2nd fair packet coming in early July. Each livestock member should plan to invite at least 5 businesses or individuals to the sale. Businesses are happy to hang the flyers in their business, they just need delivered by a smiling, sharp dressed 4-Her!

Writing and mailing letters and flyers or delivering in person teaches skills of writing, marketing, interacting with adults, customer service, introducing yourself and speaking to others, etc. These are extremely important skills and the members who do it ARE noticed!

SWINE SHOW

The show ring and layout for the Marias Fair swine show will be similar to last year. Members will be expected to have full control of their hogs from the swine barn into the show ring. The ring will be much larger so members should be very comfortable driving their hogs around a large ring. Please reach out to a livestock leader or senior swine member for help and tips on training your hog if needed.



Open Class

- Open Class registration is open through July 17 at 2024 Marias Fair https://fairentry.com/Fair/SignIn/20569 - You can register your exhibits ahead of time and then the process is streamlined for dropping your exhibits off.
- Poultry, waterfowl, rabbits and all things handmade and crafty including food are accepted. They award Blue ribbons (\$6.00 to \$7.00), Red ribbons (\$4.00 to \$5.00), and white ribbons (\$3.00) and Best of Show for \$10.00. For children under 6, they receive a beautiful ribbon for participation.
- Register online or in person Wednesday July 17 by 6:00 pm at the Open Class office under the grandstands. This is a great opportunity to take kid's craft projects, Lego projects, baking, cooking, last year's quilting/sewing, canning projects off the shelf, rabbits, chickens, etc., etc.

2024 Summer Project Day



Thank you to the Montana 4-H Foundation, Inc. for sponsoring our Summer Project Day through an Innovative Programming grant! Participants started the day off with identifying ground meat and what percentage fat each of the four meats were, before learning about intramuscular fat, blending meat to increase value of cull cattle, how fat impacts meat, and then making meatballs. Participants made meatballs that were either 100% beef, 100% pork, or a blend of beef and pork, and then enjoyed a spaghetti meatball lunch. 4-Hers also made homemade strawberry jam and hot water bath canned it, made homemade biscuits, practiced fair interviews, learned livestock marketing tips, and completed food safety.

This new rule was set in place last year to simplify our accounting process with our new debit card system.
