

Use of Lecture Capture at MSU: *How Camtasia Relay is Being Used in Instruction and Beyond*

Following the enthusiastic response to the session that took place last year, five different faculty and instructors from across the curricular spectrum at MSU will talk about their experiences using lecture capture in their classrooms, offices, and wherever they have found an application for it.



What is Camtasia Relay?

Camtasia Relay is a lecture capture system designed primarily to streamline the workflow of capturing a live presentation. The user simply chooses a profile, enters a title and description, and clicks record to capture their voice and computer screen. When finished, the recording is sent to the Camtasia Relay server, where it is automatically produced and published. The lecture may then be viewed on multiple playback devices.
