Award Highlights:


- EDA Headwaters Tech Hub award (Shaw, Electrical & Computer Engineering, \$41M) grows optics and photonics research and teaching
- NSF Accelerating Research Translation award (Juliano, Technology Transfer Office, \$6M) promotes entrepreneurship on campus
- EPA Thriving Communities Technical Assistant Center award (Haggerty, Earth Sciences, \$10M) empowers MT communities
- DOD DEPSCOR Research Collaboration award (Morris, Mechanical & Industrial Engineering, \$560K) is first in all of MT since 2019.
- NEH Summer Stipend award (Johnston, History & Philosophy) is highly competitive and considered to be prestigious.



Event Highlights:


- ORD hosted its 2nd Research Development Day, with 168 registrants and 13 programs officers joining the fullday networking event.
- ORD facilitated Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences (HASS) Faculty Charettes for ~75 faculty to improve support for HASS scholars.
- ORD co-sponsored On Impact: Building Partnerships for Engaged Scholarship to build bridges between faculty and Extension.
- ORD co-led the NSF-funded Research Administration and Development Conference (RADCon) in Rapid City, SD, for ~70 research enterprise professionals to problem-solve and network across the Northern Plains


Proposal Development is What We Do



New This Year!

- Nicole Motzer became MSU's Fulbright Scholar Liaison and launched MSU's Fulbright Matching Fund.
- ORD partnered with RD offices in five states to launch two new cooperative programs:
 - InterFACE: NIH R01, a biomedical proposal writing and mentoring cohort including three MSU faculty
 - Priority Funding Opportunities, a virtual webinar series featuring program officers and awardees from five key funding programs.
- Daniel Grant and Helaina Stergas created the Public Engagement Fellowship Program, funding and supporting community-engaged research development for 11 faculty members.
- Tracy Gatlin launched the cross-campus Grant and Proposal Coordinator Circle to increase professional development opportunities and community support for ~12 research support staff across MSU.
- ORD initiated a new and improved funding search engine and recommendation service, GrantForward.

ORD formed new relationships with the **Office of International Programs** to promote international scholarship, such as through Fulbright programs.

ORD co-funded a position with **MSU Extension** to help bridge partnerships between Extension and non-Extension faculty and fund Extension research.

ORD worked with Associate Deans for Research in **EHHD & CLS** to design and deliver collision events.

ORD worked with the **Graduate School** to deliver proposal writing training for students and postdocs.

ORD promoted connections and opportunities for MSU students and faculty through the **Institute** of Translational Health Sciences (ITHS) at UW.
